

CHAS. LUEBKE DIES AT AGE OF 78 YEARS

Charles F. Luebke, 322 East Columbian avenue, passed away Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at his home at the age of 78 years from complications following a stroke of paralysis which he suffered three weeks ago. Mr. Luebke was born in Germany on December 5, 1851, coming to Menasha in 1873. In 1877 he was united in marriage to Amilie Karrow of Menasha where they resided until 1894 when they moved to a farm in the town of Clayton where they made their home for 20 years. In 1914 they moved to Neenah where they have resided since.

The widow and seven daughters and three sons survive. The daughters are Mrs. Martin Gmeiner, Mrs. Martin Wachholz, Mrs. Carl Kuckenbecker and Mrs. Ernest Kramer, all of Neenah; Mrs. John Manteufel of the town of Clayton; Mrs. William Westphal of Oshkosh, and Miss Olga Luebke of New York city. The sons are Otto Luebke of this city, Oscar Luebke of Menasha and Carl Luebke of West Allis. Twenty-three grandchildren and Mr. Luebke's oldest brother, Fred Luebke of Mayville, also survive.

The deceased was a member of the Trinity Lutheran church and of the Lutheran Aid Society of the church.

Private funeral services will be held Friday at 1:30 p. m. from the home and at 2 p. m. from the Trinity Lutheran church, Rev. Froehlke officiating. Burial will be at Oakhill Cemetery.

This is the first death in Mr. Luebke's immediate family. Mr. and Mrs. Luebke celebrated their golden wedding anniversary at Trinity Lutheran church on November 1, 1927. Mr. Luebke was a man of sterling character, and loved and esteemed by all who knew him.



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
