

MISS KIEFER WED TO PETER DE GROOT

RECEIVES PRESENT OF \$25 FROM
COMPANY WHICH SHE SERV-
ED 7 YEARS

The wedding of Miss Mayme Kiefer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Kiefer, 1115 Franklin street and Peter DeGroot, of Little Chute was solemnized this morning at 9 o'clock at St. Joseph's church.

They were attended by Miss Katherine Kiefer, sister of the bride and Henry DeGroot brother of the groom. The bride wore a dress of white messaline trimmed with over-lace and a veil caught up with yellow roses. She carried a white prayer book and a rosary. The bridesmaid was dressed in white voile trimmed with over-lace and carried pink carnations.

After the ceremony a wedding breakfast was served at the home of the bride's parents and at noon a wedding dinner was served to about twenty-five guests. Mr. and Mrs. DeGroot left on the afternoon train for a trip to Milwaukee and Chicago. Returning they will make their home on Franklin street pending the completion of their new home on Packard street.

Mrs. DeGroot has the distinction of being the first employee of the local Five & Ten Cent store to receive a wedding gift from the company. She entered the employ of the company seven years ago when the store was opened in this city and was with it ever since up to three weeks ago when she resigned. In accordance with a rule in force she was presented with a gift of \$25 by Manager A. R. Eads. The wedding gift is given on the same basis as the Christmas gift each girl employee getting \$3 for every year of service with the company up to five years when the gift is \$25, that being the limit. She was a faithful employee of the company and had she waited until Christmas time to be married she would have received a gift of \$50, \$25 for Christmas and \$25 as a wedding present. The wedding present was presented to her on the date of her departure from the company, Manager Eads believing that time being preferable to waiting for the wedding day. A number of showers were given in her honor the past two weeks.
