

NEENAH MEAT DEALER DIES

**Albert A. Kramer, Resident of that
City more than 60 Years,
Passed Away Wednesday**

Albert A. Kramer, a resident of Neenah for more than 60 years, died at 11 o'clock Wednesday morning at his home, 317 E. Columbian avenue, following a long illness.

Born March 24, 1867, in Saxony, Germany, Mr. Kramer immigrated to the United States when a young man and since that time had resided in Neenah. He was a member of Trinity Lutheran church and the Men's Aid society of the church.

Mr. Kramer was an early day Neenah butcher, and later for many years was employed by the Bergstrom Paper company, retiring several years ago.

Surviving are the wife; three sons, Ernest A., Herman C., and Albert C. Kramer, all of Neenah; a brother, Reinhold Kramer, Oshkosh, and seven grandchildren.

The body has been removed to the Pelton-Eckardt Funeral home, but arrangements for the funeral had not been completed.
