

Damage Claim Is Result Of City's 'Goof'

MENASHA — As the result of what Mayor John Klein referred to as a “goof” by city employees while flushing sewer lines, the city has been served with a claim for damages to personal property. The common council was told that more claims may be forthcoming.

During Tuesday evening's formal council session, City Clerk-Comptroller Harry Kind presented a claim by Dan Ecklund, RF 4, Appleton, for damages which his home allegedly suffered when a city sewer line backed up and flooded his property. The council accepted the claim, and turned it over to the city attorney for processing with the city's insurance carrier.

Other claims against the city, as a result of injuries received in falls on sidewalks, were presented to the city by attorneys representing Jody R. Smith, daughter of Gordon Smith, 344 Oak St., Menasha. Miss Smith fell on a slippery walk at Menasha High School on February 26, 1968.

The other claim was from Bruce Frederick, student, son of Arthur Frederick, 621 Richards Drive, Menasha.

Both claims were referred to the office of the city attorney for processing.



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
